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
Brief introduction to Interreg




NPA 2021-2027

- New geography:
 - UK no longer included
 - Efforts ongoing to include Russia
 - Smaller changes in NO and IE area
- Budget: ≈ 43,7 MEUR ERDF
 + ERDF equivalent (NO, IS, FO, GL)
- Themes:
 - PO1 Smarter Europe
 - PO2 Greener, low-carbon Europe
 - ISO1 Better cooperation governance
- Status: programme document out for national approval. Plan to submit to EC before end 2021.
- First Call planned to be launched on 17th
 March 2022, running until June 2022.
- How to Apply seminars and partner search events will be planned for the Spring 2022.
