CBC: Cross-Border Cooperation in "optimal" environments (EU internal borders) also face growing challenges



- 1. CB regions are a small-scale Europe
- 2. Many obstacles to overcome, but also many little daily stories in positive (CBC belongs to Europe's Positive Agenda, like the Erasmus Programme)
- 3. Main challenges:
 - Effects of "re-nationalization" and skepticism (Brexit, anti-European movements, nationalism); migration phenomena; and then strengthened border controls
 - Unemployment and lack of opportunities
 - Brain-drain and demographic change; climate change and clean energies
 - Access to ICTs, (CB) Smart Specialization Strategies (RIS3), innovation practices, etc.

Response to the exigence of welfare and prosperity for all territories

CBC during the COVID-19 pandemic

- Policy makers have previously ignored CBC and CB interaction in most cases (capitals are too far away from borders)
- Then, towards the declaration of pandemic, their first idea was...
- 1. ...borders closing to control dissemination of the virus:
 - national control measures, little coordination
- 2. Urgent re-opening, in particular to essential services (and essential CBC); discovery of "cross-border" realities:
 - Many services (also essential ones) and value chains depend on workforce, providers and other players across the border
 - Conscience of CBC at all levels
- 3. EU and CB Coordination:
 - Green Lanes and other measures
 - Use of CB structures to guarantee essential services across borders
- 4. CBC was included in most political agendas (European and national ones) but, for how long?

Most figures dropped due to the reduction of the regular budget of the EU due to the **Brexit**. However, the real impact of the **New Generation EU – NGEU** (the extraordinary fund for reconstruction) in CBC programmes is still unknown


Integrates cooperation with third countries (involving external financing instruments: IPA III, NDICI & ODA)

Policy recommendations

- **1. Capacity building** of local stakeholders in borders regions:
 - a. improved training provision for LRA & CBC actors;
 - b. support for information/coordination units at the LRA;
 - c. commissioning detailed comparative studies;
 - d. strengthening capacity within professional service firms

- 2. Promotion of effective multi-level engagement and responses
 - a. Legal mechanisms
 - b. Joint commissioning of CB studies & analyses
 - c. Enhanced forums of dialogue
- 3. Maximising the value of **EU tools and instruments**
 - a. The proposed ECBM
- b. Interreg and other existing EU instruments





New tasks

- Identified at borders affected by migratory phenomena (but not only): minorities and particularly vulnerable groups.
- Identified at hitherto very stable borders, even within the EU (re-bordering): conflict resolution and overcoming; but there is also an emergence of a "cross-border civil society" (and labour markets, ...)
- Risk prevention: natural disasters, pandemics
